Subject:-Grant of Conditional Permission to Dev Bhoomi Medical College of Ayurveda & Hospital, Navgaon Manduwala, Dehradun-248007, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0518) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

- 1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Dev Bhoomi Medical College of Ayurveda & Hospital, Navgaon Manduwala, Dehradun-248007, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0518) inspection of your College was conducted on 01.02.2024 & 02.02.2024 and re-visited on 18.03.2024 and 19.03.2024 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Asessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.
- Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcoming/defect have been observed:-

1) Central Library:-

a) There is short coming of 1389 no. of books against the minimum requirement of 10000 total no. books as per MSR.

2) Teaching staffs:-

- a) Availability of total teaching staff for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course after considering the teachers is  $\frac{Available}{Required}x100\% = \frac{24}{30}x100\% = 80\%$  (Excluding Excess and visitor observation report) which is not fulfilling the criteria as per Schedule-V of MSR 2016.

3) Functionality of the hospital:-

- a) There were zero deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2023 to 31st Dec 2023.
- 3. As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the 88<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 03.05.2024. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 10.05.2024 to appear on 16.05.2024 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the conditional permission to your college with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied.
- 4. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Dr. Amit Chaudhary Principal, Dr. Anurag Assistant Professor Dr Arjun Singh Registrar appeared before the Hearing Committee on 16.05.2024 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the proposed Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

2. We had duly published an advertisement before filling part-1 and again we have given advertisement when few faculties got selected as Medical Officer Uttarakhand Govt. - in the response to advertisement, we appointed some extra faculties before part-1 and some after theat.

We have shortcomings in the department of Rog Nidan aavaum Vikriti vigyan and Shalakhya Tantra (HF), which is already shown in Part-1 also. (It is requested to consider this deficiency towards the 10% relaxation granted as per schedule of MSR 2016 to colleges.

- (i) In the department of Prasuti and Stri Roga 1 Assistant Professor named as Dr. Deepti Durgapal was there till 05.02.2024 and in the department of Kaumarbhritya -Bala Roga Dr. Swabi was there up to 08.02.2024. Dr. Deepti Durgapal Department of Prasuti and Stri Roga as Assistant Professor was on maternity leave and Dr. Swabi- Department of Kaumarbhritya - Bala Roga was present on the days of (Documents photograph are attached). Both have submitted affidavit for inspection that was on 1st and 2<sup>nd</sup>Febuary-2024.
- (ii) Both of them got selected as Medical Officer in Govt. of Uttarakhand and in consideration of their bright future, we relieved both of them immediately.
- a) In support of that, their Govt. Selection order is attached.
- b) Since then, Dr. Sonia Kadwal joined on 21.03.2024 in the department of Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga and Dr. Shabna Rani joined in the department of Prasuti and Stri Roga on dated

- 5. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 90<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 17.05.2024.
- 6. Therefore, conditional permission is issued to Dev Bhoomi Medical College of Ayurveda & Hospital, Navgaon Manduwala, Dehradun-248007, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0518) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 along with warning to fulfill the shortcoming which is as under: -
  - I. There is short coming of 1389 no. of books against the minimum requirement of 10,000 total no. books as per MSR 2016.
  - II. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- III. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- IV. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act& Regulations thereunder.
- 8. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any

University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.

- 9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:
  - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
  - iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, should be fulfilled.
- 11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
